

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR



the weekend On Masses in honor of the **Feast** of the Presentation of the Lord, on February 1 and 2nd, the homily proclaimed our call to "open wide the door of the temple of our

hearts" to let in the Lord whom we seek. As the prophet Malachi, inspired by the Holy Spirit, exhorted all of us said, "And suddenly there will come to the temple the LORD whom you seek, and the messenger of the covenant whom you desire" (Malachi 3:1b).

But, how do we open the gates or doors of our hearts, how do we keep them open, and how shall we cooperate to keep them opening ever wider? I presented three simple ways in which all of us could respond to those questions. For all of us, conscious or not, desire God's presence; and God above all else, desires to abide in us, His prized place to reside. So, let us meet God and our heart's desires with these three daily practices in our lives: 1. to live a life of gratitude, which opens the soul, the very core of our being, to live lives of magnanimity . . . to be a "large souled" people; and, 2. to let gratitude overflow into a life of generosity to God in lives of worship and obedience to His commandments while perceiving meeting the needs of our neighbor; and, 3. to live a life of daily on-going prayer, where the soul speaks in friendship to God of the deep desires of the heart while

listening to His response to act with virtue and to resist sin.

Each and every one of us are called to be made whole in Christ, called to holiness in imitation of God, to energetically practice the gifts of the Holy Spirit by proclaiming the Kingdom of God, and to a greatness for which God has created us! We should not, nor shall any disciple of Christ, let him or herself be robbed by the adversary of our souls . . . wait for next week's bulletin for the answer to a more robust life in Christ!
