



As we rapidly approach the Lenten season, we Catholics are called to "give alms". The foundational call of Christians to charity is a frequent theme of the Gospels. During Lent, we are asked to focus more intently on "almsgiving," which means donating money or goods to the poor and performing other acts of charity. As one of the three pillars of Lenten practice, almsgiving is "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 2462).

The Gospel today causes me to reflect upon thoughts of this reading when I was younger. My dad was a fisherman. He went to Canada every summer to fish with his buddies. He would

take my brothers and sisters and I fishing every once in a while to my grandparents' cabin. I have a particular memory of my older sister catching a catfish off a homemade pole constructed of an ice-scraper, 3 feet of fishing line, a hook and a piece of cheese. My experience of fishing was always of a pole, hook and line. Whenever I used to read these readings of the apostles being "fishers-of-men," I imagined the apostles spreading the love of Jesus one by one like a fish and a pole. It was a startling re-adjusting of my thoughts when I realized they used fishing nets to fish. They would cast out the weighted net broadly stretching a wide path, catchmultitudes of fish that would be pulled in collectively. In my further reflection, both styles of fishing reflect the way lesus loves us. He teaches us truth and love in a way that is for all of us like a net and simultaneously teaches us personally about truth and love in a way that is like fishing with a pole. As we journey through the seas of life, it is ultimately most important that we be caught by His love.
