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A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

The weekly notes that I share with you have received many positive expressions of encouragement and appreciation. I envision this weekly bulletin column as a type of “conversation” with the members of the parish family. I try to share what is going on in the parish, what we are working on, what some of our concerns might be, and I indicate if there are some kinds of plans being discussed or some type of effort that demands our attention and focus. These notes are not intended to be the “minutes of a meeting,” or the declaration of a pastoral plan for the parish, or anything formal. They are intended as a conversation and only as a conversation.

Since it is a conversation, these few words are free flowing and off the “top of my head” so to speak and never edited for content or context. I assume, rightly or wrongly, that if a clarification is needed I will be asked in the course of normal conversation with you. Indeed, this is my experience most weeks. It is not at all unusual that a parishioner mentions something that I conversed about and we have an extended conversation about it. It is natural and I hope helpful.

Unfortunately, even though this is what I intend, “a conversation” with members of the parish family, it seems that this is not the expectation of some of our parishioners. For these parishioners, the notes that I share are something akin to official declarations of policy or suggestive of some kind of authoritative decision made without reference to anyone else, including the representative and consultative bodies that have been established such as the Parish Council and the Finance Council. Evidently, I need to outline every step taken and report every effort and steer away from the conversational format and make this weekly sharing more official or something like that.

For example, it has come to my attention that in these notes I mentioned that “something big was in the planning stages.” I made reference to this before the Corn Fest last year and then after the Corn Fest never mentioned it again. What could this be and why did I not follow-up on what I wrote in the notes? Well, what it could be was that we, by we I mean Barbara (our Administrator at the time) and others suggested that we start a process of collecting funds for necessary maintenance and the painting of the church. It was envisioned that when Corn Fest was complete this would be an opportune time to begin the effort and I agreed. Unfortunately, what intervened in the period of time when we were waiting to begin the effort, Barbara resigned from her position as Administrator and the effort and focus moved away from the maintenance plan and toward the recruitment and hiring of a new Administrator. Nothing sinister, nothing underhanded, just a necessary change in plans and focus. It never occurred to me to make reference to this change in focus but I guess I should have.

A second point that has been brought to my attention was that I mentioned that for the Parish stewardship effort I was going to “try something different.” According to the person who reported this concern to me, I played videos about stewardship for the four weeks of November at each of the masses but I never did “something different” as promised. Well, the videos played at mass was the “something different” that I promised. I thought that this was a better way of handling stewardship than me preaching about it or having a member of the finance council talk about it at the masses. I guess I messed up on that one!

Despite these concerns that I have just shared with you, I still believe that this weekly “conversation,” although obviously imperfect, is nonetheless helpful for most parishioners. For this reason, I intend to continue the conversation. As always if there are any questions or concerns about anything, do not hesitate to ask. Any member of the staff is more than willing to share with you the process that is in place and the efforts that we are trying to make on your behalf. Have a great week and let us continue to remember each other in our thoughts and prayers.
