

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This is our last week of the liturgical part of the year designated as “Ordinary Time.” On Wednesday, March 6 we begin the liturgical season of Lent. By now you should have received numerous communications about the service schedule for Ash Wednesday. We will offer the distribution of ashes within the Eucharist at 8:30 AM and also 5:00 PM. We will also have the distribution of ashes within the context of the Liturgy of the Word at 12:00 PM (noon) and also at 7:00 PM. A soup supper for all, which will be hosted in the St. Francis Hall, is a good way to begin your Lenten practice. Please consider joining us either after the 5:00 PM mass or before the 7:00 PM service (if you choose the 7:00 PM service there is no need to worry about the Eucharistic Fast).

Also during Lent we will celebrate daily Eucharist, Monday through Friday, in the Church at 8:30 AM. The service each day will be celebrated in a simple manner with the singing of an opening and a closing song. On Wednesday, the day that we traditionally dedicate to Eucharistic Adoration, we will begin Adoration in the church and then, at 12:00 Noon, we will move the Eucharist to the chapel. Perhaps providing for a more public opportunity for Adoration in the Church might serve as an invitation to stop by and pray with the Lord, also as part of your Lenten Practice. The purpose for moving the daily celebration of the Eucharist into the Church is anticipation of the larger number of people who routinely attend mass during the liturgical season of Lent. Our daily mass chapel would be stretched to the limit if we tried to use this small space, so the decision was made to meet in the Church. Everyone is encouraged to attend the Eucharist throughout Lent, if this is something that your daily schedule permits, even if only once in a while.

We have also planned all of the liturgies of Lent through and up to the celebration of Easter. We are trying to set a more contemplative (prayerful) setting that will encourage the spirit of the liturgical season. In addition to our regular Lenten opportunities parishioners are encouraged to pray the traditional Stations of the Cross (booklets are available both in the Church and in the chapel) and also to choose some kind of Lenten practice that will help you focus on the importance of these days of preparation for the Feast of Easter. Traditionally, people try and choose some sort of Lenten discipline for their spiritual practice by choosing to “give-up” something for Lent. That is a good idea but it is not the only spiritual practice worth considering. You might also choose to add some discipline to your life during Lent by devoting time for prayer and meditation, for example, that is not part of your usual routine and pattern. Sometimes adding some sort of spiritual practice is far more helpful than deleting something from your routine.

It is also a good practice, at the beginning of Lent, to begin to focus on your personal and family schedule by looking ahead to Holy Week. Holy Week will be Thursday,

April 18. Good Friday is Friday, April 19. Holy Saturday is April 20. Easter Sunday is April 21. If you plan now you might be able to join the parish community for one or all of these important liturgical celebrations. What sometimes happens is because of the demands of everyday life, even though it is Lent, Holy Week has a way of “sneaking-up” on us and we absentmindedly plan something that conflicts with our attendance at one of the Liturgical Services that we intended to be part of. Making a deliberate intention and focus at the beginning of Lent does not guarantee that nothing will conflict with your plans but at the very least it enables a real possibility and intention.

Personally I am looking forward to Lent. Spiritually I find it to be a very helpful time of the year. With all of the feelings that I have being “weighed down” by winter and all of the snow and the ice, not to mention the wind, Lent provides me with an opportunity to change my focus. I begin to anticipate the new life of Easter and the promise of Spring that comes with the feast. Let us remember each other in our thoughts and in our prayers during the coming liturgical season of God’s grace and blessing.
