A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

You may have noticed that we are moving furniture around, clearing away bulletin boards, throwing away items that seem to no longer serve a purpose, all in all just a general SPRING cleaning of the church. The more we clean and the more we clear away the more we become aware of areas of the church and the gathering spaces that need our attention. We are slowly getting everything in order.

I can inform you that the transition process to the naming of a new pastor continues in full swing. We have made the beginning steps to set-up a parishioner transition team that is representative of our parish community. This team will be involved in all of the stages of preparing for and welcoming our new pastor. I anticipate that we should be able to make an announcement about the new pastor sometime after Easter and the plan remains that he will be in place at St. Gerard no later than July 1, 2019. I am quite excited about the progress that is being made and I am confident that the person chosen will serve the community well.

The archdiocese is making extensive use of the results of the "listening session" that was held two years ago and they are also referencing other reports and resources. Key personnel who are familiar with the parish and the needs of the parish have been involved in the process. I have met with perspective candidates and have had the essential conversations with them about the life of the parish, the hopes and dreams of the community and other related issues. I repeat over and over again that St. Gerard strengths include great liturgy and music ministry, a robust commitment to social justice and outreach, and a volunteer community that goes well beyond the minimum. There is a measurable sense of welcome and caring in this parish family.

The challenges include the fact that the parish has been in constant transition for the last three years and there is a longing for stability. The parish community is rapidly changing and growing at a sustained pace. The campus is in need of updates and repair. The facilities as a whole are underutilized and there needs to be a creative response to this fact. The staff has changed and transitioned over the last few years, and continues to do so, but we have a strong and talented core. Ministers of the Word and Ministers of the Eucharist continue to be committed to service although we need some outreach and inclusion in these ministries so that they better represent the parish community.

In the midst of all of this we continue to enter as fully as possible into the season of Lent. I continue to find it both spiritually nourishing and helpful. I think what we have planned is one way to prepare us for the solemn liturgies of Holy Week and the weekend of Easter. Let

us continue our Lenten practices and continue to remember each other in prayer.

“PRESENT TO THE PASSION” MUSICAL

This week’s People of the Passion: (Visit www.st-gerard.org to hear the song for each character.)



1) **The Executioner** - Some occupations are a mystery. When it’s in your job description to, on a regular basis, cause another human being’s death, there must be repercussions for your spirit. The callousness of a Roman executioner is expressed in the song, “The Hammer” as even this hardened, tragic figure is surprised by the resolute serenity of the Prisoner he is ordered to execute. Reflect at the ways you have hardened your heart during this season and seek ways to be surprised by God’s spirit around you.

2) **Mary Magdalene** has been a fascinating, complicated figure throughout our history. In this scene, she is standing at the foot of the cross (Matthew 27:55, Mark 15:40, John 19:25). Like many of us, she stands vigil, helplessly watching as her loved one suffers and dies. In that moment, aware that she is observing the sacred passage between two worlds, she speaks of the complexities of all of her emotions: the grief, the rage, the horror, the injustice, the relief when it is finally over... As you reflect on “A Terrible Beauty”, recall a moment of painful dying in your life and be present to the gift and myriad of your emotions.
