No Hassles Food Shelf provides clothing, school supplies and food for youth ages 12 to 21 and is located at Cross of Glory Lutheran Church in Brooklyn Center. The food shelf is partnership between CEAP and the YMCA StreetWorks youth outreach collaborative. The food shelf is open from 3-6 p.m. on Wednesdays and Fridays.
